Build It Together

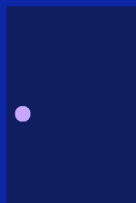
Our cornerstone is partnership. The foundation is community, supported by camaraderie, collaboration and cooperation. We thrive when others feel successful.

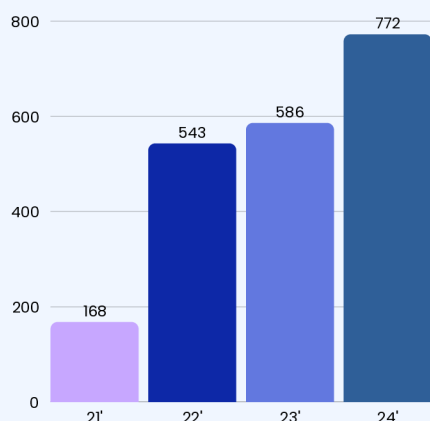


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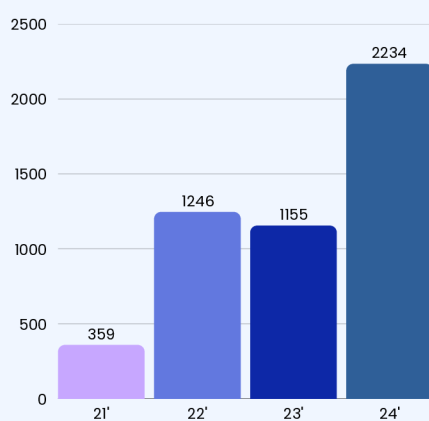
GROWTH IN 2024

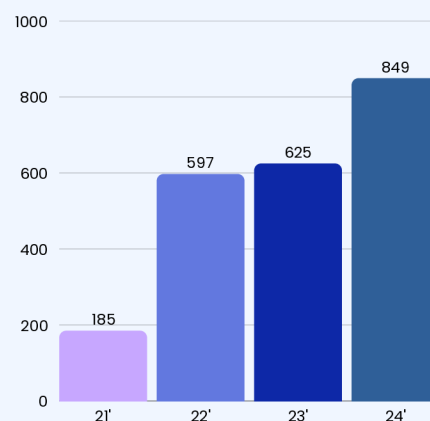

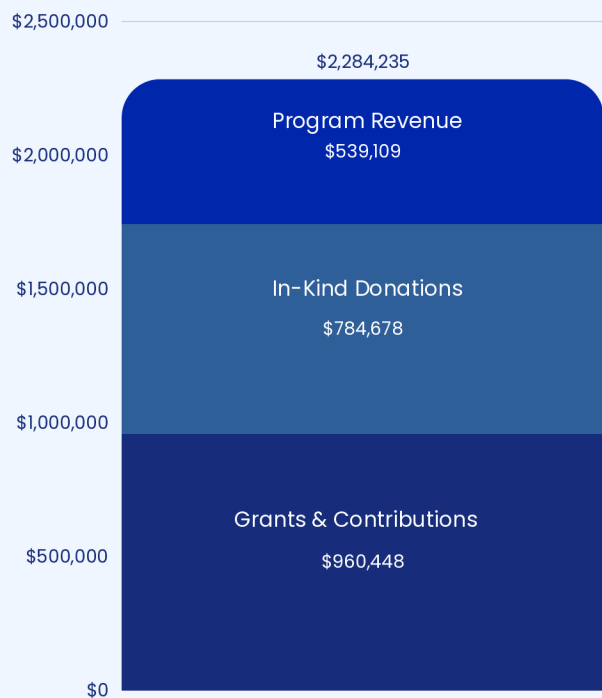

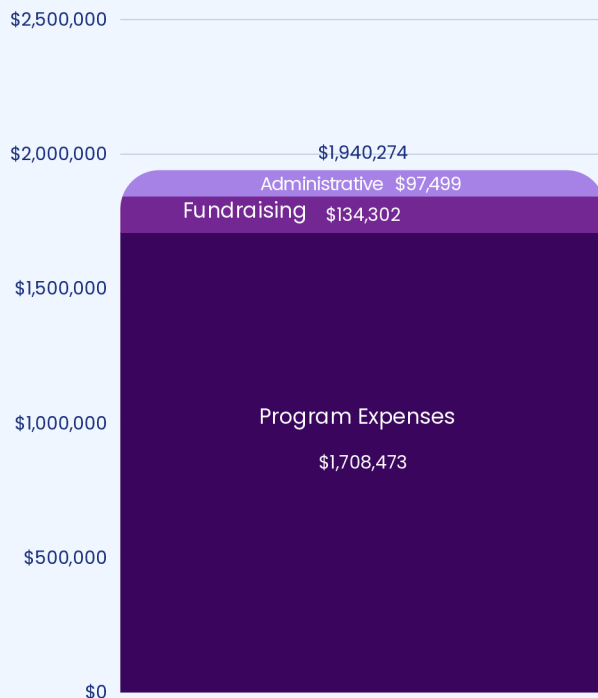

EXPENSES

In FY2024, Make It Home raised almost \$1.5 million in cash revenue through grants, individual contributions, service and delivery fees, and warehouse sales. This vital funding allowed us to grow our reach and serve more households across the Bay Area. We remain deeply committed to using our resources wisely. 88% of our cash expenses supported direct program services—including furniture deliveries, operations, and staffing.

In addition to cash donations, Make It Home also received generous in-kind donations of furniture and home goods from both individuals and businesses. These donors shared a common goal; to ensure their gently-used items went to help someone in need rather than ending up in a landfill. In FY2024, we received nearly \$785,000 worth of donated furnishings—each piece helping transform empty spaces into welcoming, functional homes for those starting over.



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THE POWER OF COMMUNITY

We hosted three impactful events—our Salvage and Style, Design with Impact and Furnish Hope—bringing together local designers, community members, and supporters who share our vision. Through these events, we raised over \$250,000.



COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS

Our volunteers are essential to every step of our work. They sort and measure donated furniture, clean and organize household goods, curate and style home setups, assist with inventory management, prep for warehouse sales, and help us load and unload items for delivery. Many also bring professional skills—like upholstery repair, graphic design, or event planning—to support our mission in creative and meaningful ways. Their time, energy, and



heart make it possible for us to serve so many households every week.

Our community members, most of them retirees, donated more than 14,000 hours this year to help us deliver comfort and dignity to families across the Bay Area. We are incredibly grateful for their support.

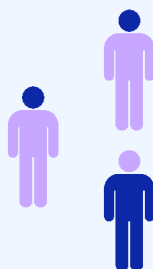
Give Furniture
