Make it Home transforms empty houses into welcoming homes so the most marginalized families in our community will have beds to sleep in and tables to gather around.

With a little TLC, Make it Home refurbishes gently-used and donated furnishings, literally keeping tons of material from landfills. In 2022, Make it Home proudly became a Certified California Green Business.



Make It Home's mission is to help Bay Area families and individuals transitioning out of crisis. We recycle, repurpose, and curate gently-used, donated furnishings to transform empty spaces into homes. Our vision is to end furniture poverty while protecting the environment.

Make It Home was started by former interior designer Carolyn Rebuffel Flannery, who was inspired to start a nonprofit furniture bank that combined her concern for sustainability in the design industry and her desire to help kids coming out of foster care. In 2020, she decided to wind down her interior design business in order to focus on building a local nonprofit that diverts furniture away from the landfill and helps families and individuals in need.

"For those transitioning out of homelessness or aging out of the foster care system, even basic household goods are unaffordable. Even when people gain access to subsidized housing, there's typically zero furniture and no money to get any after groceries and bills. More than just a table to study at or a bed to sleep in, we offer people pride of place." ~Carolyn Rebuffel Flannery

Make It Home solves multiple problems at once by partnering with local Bay Area social service agencies to furnish the homes of families and young adults who are experiencing furniture poverty as they transition out of crisis. Our team of volunteers helps receive, sort, repair, refurbish, and then disperse gently used furniture to those in need. Now, with warehouses in San Rafael and Walnut Creek, we are more accessible to help clients across the region. This report highlights our work over the last year and is updated often. ## Fostering New Beginnings

At Make It Home, we love when we can partner with other nonprofits to extend the impact of their amazing work.

Founded in 1945, Hanna Center is a teen residential treatment center in Sonoma, California. Most of Hanna's residents have experienced high levels of adversity, including abuse, neglect, family strife and community violence.

Starting in fall of 2022, Hanna Center is broadening their efforts and opening their new Transitional Age Housing Program for youth ages 18-21 who are aging out of the traditional foster care system. This much needed new program will provide a safe and supportive environment during what can be a challenging time.

Make It Home is excited to help the Hanna Center launch their new project by curating and creating their transitional housing. In August 2022, a crackerjack team of Make It Home volunteers traveled with our incredible movers and installed the first 12 of 58 planned studios. The next phase of 10 additional studios and 3 common rooms is set to be installed in October of 2022.

Make It Home is privileged to partner with Hanna Center and to be a small part of helping these youth as they prepare to begin their journey into adulthood.






## Community Support


#### THIS PAST YEAR...


